No e-vehicle charge stations but some locals have battery chargers if that would help. Presently, no Information Centre but our locals have opinions that may help. There is a **Public WC** in the east side park. No **trash cans**, but the recycle place (locally known as the Mall) will receive your trash. While there you may refresh your wardrobe (one local brags he only buys underwear and socks). As a bonus, help yourself to the hundreds of refundable bottles destined for crushing (gas money). Parking: Bamfield has pioneered the art of ditch parking. Take care you do not bust your oil pan (oil kills what is left of our singing frogs). On the plus side it is difficult to steal catalytic converters from ditched cars. Local attractions: RN run Bamfield Health Clinic (waiting usually under 1 minute). Bamfield Historical Society strategically placed posters illustrating our past. the Canadian leading Bamfield Marine Sciences Centre's gift shop, Rix Centre and relicts of the old Cable Station. 

IAN WALLACE July 10, 1951 to April 25, 2024. lan was a true Bamfield Boy. He spent his early life in Bamfield with his father **Johnny**, who was a telegraph operator for the Cable Station, his mother **Kay** and his younger brother **Rick**. The family moved to Port Alberni for the boys' high school and Ian returned to Bamfield 1976. He began work for **Gary Jackson** at the west side fish camp, became a deckhand for **Sigurd Tveit**, working on the dragger *Leik* and then joined the Coast Guard Station at the request of Captain David Hegstrom in late 70's. He later transferred to the Parksville Hovercraft Coast Guard Station (French Creek) until he retired. Ian's nickname was Holiday lan, working 1 week on and 1 week off. During off times he enjoyed sailing his Hobbie Cat, boating, fishing, hanging with his friends. He was always ready to help in any project going on in the inlet. It was lan's idea to turn the old BC Packers wooden stave tank into a sauna and hot tub, where many fabulous parties were held. Ian lived and worked with Geoff Lindsay andd Rob Saunders at Canadian Benthic at the old BC Packers building and then with Paul Ryan at the Ranch in Letcher's Point in Grapper Inlet. Many a great dinner party was held at the Ranch, with Jerry Jeff Walker playing to the wee hours of the morning, after a sauna at Peter Janitis' home. Eventually he moved to a small cabin behind the post office, (Mary Berkholder cottages) where he was a popular entertainer, his afternoon cocktails always included pink gins with Angostura Bitters when the tonic water ran out. The ex-fisheries patrol boat, Pursepa and skipper Bruce Evans returned to Bamfield in the late 80's. On many a dark and stormy night, lan and Bruce would pilot the Pursepa to the secret side-stripe prawn glory hole which Sigurd had shown lan. Using the Marine Station's otter trawl, the two would bring back a feed of side-stripes for parties at Packers, and marine samples for the Station. The Macmillan fish camp became a popular Friday afternoon happy hour with Mike Warren preparing his legendary martinis and pickled herring. With help from Dave Howell



the camp was often the source of magnificent seafood dinners. After one of these lan helped inaugurate the Packers hot tub and sauna, where I met my wife, **Kristi Miller**, who also became lan's long-term friend. At one of the many great Bamfield Community Hall Dances, he met his first wife **Debra Warren** and when he moved to Parksville, they married and raised two boys: **Cameron** and **Mathew Wallace.** Ian's career in the Coast Guard saw many marine rescues and emergencies on Lasqueti Island where he met **Bruce** and **Gor**-

don Jones of Innovative Aquaculture, where he loved to visit and help build widgets in his off hours. Ian was a friend to all

and was always ready to step in to lend a hand, whether with **Dan Thorlakson** at his Quadra Island property or at Horne Lake building our cabin, Ian was a man you could always count on, fun to be with and always with a quick joke. Ian and Debra separated in the early 2000's. Soon after he married **Susanna**. The marriage did not last, and Ian moved back to Parksville. One of his many return trips back to Bamfield to visit his good friend **Steve Clarke**, he attended one of

Steve's legendary birthday martini parties there he met the love of his life, **Susan Derasp**. Susan and Ian soon purchased a house on the west side and settled back into Bamfield life. I accompanied Ian on his visit to the cancer doctor back in 2000. Ian and Dr. **Denigra** hit it off immediately and were soon trading fishing jokes. When it came time for the bad news, Dr. Denigra promised Ian another 5 more years of good life. He has proven the Doc wrong and out lived the predictions by two decades! In late 2022, Ian's cancer came back with a vengeance, and this week he passed quietly with family nearby. To know him was to love him. *Rob Saunders*
