May Affairs, attended by 33 Zoomers

Lasted a pleasant 80 minutes. Our Regional Director, **Bob Beckett**, thanked the Community Affairs crew, outlined e-vehicle charge options [don't hold your breath], and explained the new ACRD committee: The Bamfield Services Committee, comprised of 4 volunteers (C. Gruman, L. Bye, J. Mass, B. Schmidt), and 3 ACRD Board Directors, whose function is to make recommendations to the ACRD Board on all aspects of Bamfield Waste Management, Parks, Volunteer Fire Department, Emergency Planning and Water System. John Jack, the elected chief of HFN introduced the HFN Framework Plan. The two consulting companies will assist HFN develop a long-term master plan on how to diversify their economy and attract outside interest. The plan will include the treaty lands as well as the private lands. Bamfield residents are included just as much as Huu ay aht citizens. There may be discomfort for some as the plans unfold but John would like everyone affected to be included in the process. He emphasized that there will be one economy and one community. Sheryl Mass, Parks, Bones is the new maintenance guy and Oscar the summer student. Thanks, Bamfield C. of C. for picnic in West Park. Bamfield Harbour Authority - Tom Jensen, A dock manager is still needed for the summer. A new ACRD committee for Bamfield.
