From lowering the flags in honour of the residential school victims, to unveiling a commemorative plaque, to pre-meal HFN singers, dancers and drummers, to a catered lunch, the approximate 200 attendees were well served and informed. The guests all received cedar roses and medicine bags with either sage or sweet grass. Stella Peters and Robert Dennis shared their residential school experiences. Chief Councillor John Jack spoke on the meaning of the event and he thanked the attendees, A thoughtful event. Thank you, Huu-ay-aht First Nation.

**Bamfield is a wagon wheel**, self contained and self supported. The Sarita River took our **Bob Baden**. And we lost many spokes on the Bamfield wheel. Bob, the Politician/ citizen, as Chair of the Bamfield Community Affairs Society kept the bad guys at bay and the village moving smoothly. When not in office, his opinion was often

sought, Then there was the parking issue, that he volunteered to oversee: many new parking spots were created, many stymied, but the problem persists. **Bob the Builder** operated Bamfield Builders Supply for several years, educating we come-from-awayers, in the lingua of construction, providing essentials such as reading glasses



and magnetic flashlights, and saving us trips to town. He could be grumpy, but he always came through: supporting youths in basketball, this newspaper, and anyone who sought help. Bob, a founder of Archipelago Marine Research, served as a Bamfield Marine Station Diving and Safety Officer and later, tried his hand at mussel farming. Hobbies? It's fair to say, Bob had two: keeping an eye on our village and creating a lovely and inviting home with his partner Shirley and their daughter Natasha. Ours is a terrible loss, and Shirley and Natasha's loss is beyond what I can conceive. Bob, you left us too soon, but you left with a great legacy. Thank you! RIP. *L. 
